I am Ashutosh Singla, currently pursuing Masters in Communication Engineering from RWTH Aachen University, Germany. I completed my Bachelors from LNMIIT, Jaipur and I believe that the most memorable part of my 4 year B.Tech programme were two semesters (5th and 8th) from IIT-Gn through Student Exchange Programme. This kind of thing is generally not possible in India, but in our institute, LNMIIT has a policy that some students may be permitted to pursue courses/semester in other academic institutions in India or even abroad, as non-degree students through Student Exchange Programme. It helps to broaden the horizon of students and also increases collaboration between institutes and some other benefits, For this, I feel a special gratitude towards two of my professors Prof. Dheeraj Sanghi and Prof. S.K. Jain as they made my dream of becoming an IITian true.

Joining IIT-Gn through Student Exchange Programme proved to be a turning point in my life. It brought a lot of positive changes in me at personal as well as intellectual level. Before joining IIT Gn in 5th semester, I was worried about how am I going to survive among the best minds of the nation. In initial days, I looked myself as a stranger among the forty odd people in my class but gradually everything started to fall in place; I started enjoying the lectures, made some of the best friends and became accustomed to IIT-Gn's ambience.

Prof. Abhijit Mishra gave his valuable suggestions for improving my SOP and CV. My friends (Nishant Joshi, Kishore Rathnavel, and Vivek Maheswary) who consistently motivated me, and reviewed my applications, and finally in the first week of April, I got Admission Letter from RWTH Aachen.

Following are the things which I liked the most in IIT-Gn:

- 1. Attending lectures of Prof. Joycee Mekie; I was so inspired and motivated by the way of teaching that during the whole 5th semester I didn't miss even a single second of her lectures.
- 2. Doing my BTP-II (in 8th semester) with Prof. Surendra Ranganath. By working with him I learnt the organized way of doing project; never give up attitude, and different perspectives of looking into the problem and solving them. This attitude helped me a lot in keeping me motivated during the up's and downs of my MS applications.
- 3. Students and Faculties always treated me like a student of IIT-Gn; I never felt I was away from my home institute.
- 4. Students are the main stakeholders of an institute, I saw in IIT-Gn how student cared about reputation of their institute.
- 5. A place where I have seen a lot of self motivated students.
